The picture on the left is the school building in a village in India which has been constructed because of charitable contribution from our people in Australia. On the right are the students proudly displaying their catch after going fishing in the drying billabong.



These children need urgent help from us as the underground drinking water of the village is highly contaminated by **Arsenic** (which causes cancer) and excessive iron.

Hindi School Kogarah in Sydney is organising a charity for the establishment of a RO (Reverse osmosis) plant at the cost of \$4000 (approx.) at Rannuchak, Bhagalpur, Bihar. This one time investment will provide free clean drinking/cooking water to thousands of the poor people for years to come. It will also provide employment to some of the most disadvantaged people. A committee (Mukhia/ Sarpanch and few responsible people) has been formed to maintain the project at the village level (Contacts: +918051304322, +919934895111).

The cost of the building and the tube-well (which is more than half of total project cost) is already being met by the people of the village. The cost of RO filter plant is about \$4000 and we have already raised nearly \$2000 by now. **WE NEED YOUR HELP TO REACH OUR TARGET DURING THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS.** Any amount from \$5 onwards will go a long way to help the cause.
